| Permanent closure | Forced cessation of normal activities owing to insolvency, events owing to force majeure, etc | <p>In the event of imminent and permanent closure, enabling students to complete their foundation course will remain SCL's first priority. Academic and administrative staff will take all action necessary to support students affected to ensure that:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - All remaining taught components of the foundation course are delivered, either in-house, through foundation partner organisations or through recognised educational providers offering equivalent programmes - UCAS applications for all enrolled candidates are completed and submitted - Any historic or emergent VISA issues have been resolved - Communication with the Home Office is maintained regarding changes to CAS status - External stakeholders such as foundation partner organisations and agency representatives are kept up-to-date with ongoing developments |

| Partial closure | Temporary staff shortages, sector-wide shutdown, site damage, etc, leading to a cessation or prolonged interruption of normal activities | <p>In the event of temporary or partial site closure, SCL will take all necessary steps to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Relocate students to alternative and nearby premises within the TSC group, or to alternative providers with comparable facilities. Full risk assessment of alternative sites will be undertaken prior to their use. - Revise student timetables to enable the delivery of course components in existing facilities unaffected by closure. In the event that this requires tuition or student contact sessions to take place outside of normal school hours (08.00 - 18.00), all affected stakeholders will be consulted and consensus sought before implementation of the new timetable. - Recruit additional qualified tutors on a temporary basis to cover staff shortfalls - Switch to remote learning delivery using video communication platforms such as Zoom, Google Meets etc. Relevant training will be provided to all stakeholders prior to initiation. |
| Licence to operate | Loss of or restrictions to Tier 4 Sponsor Licence | <p>SCL will take all necessary steps within their power to ensure minimal service disruption to students enrolled on foundation programmes by:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Working with UKVI to ensure in-course students can complete the programme of study on which they have enrolled - Enabling any students who have already received a VISA following CAS allocation by SCL to enrol and begin their study programme - Engaging partner organisations and/or educational providers offering equivalent programmes to deliver remaining components of the course - Inviting students who have not yet left their country of origin to postpone their enrolment until the relevant licensing issues have been resolved - Assisting students to take up sponsorship with an alternative provider within our network of contacts |

| Accreditation | Loss of accreditation from foundation programme accreditation provider | <p>SCL will take timely action in order to</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Reach agreement with the accreditation body on measures to ensure affected students can complete their programme of study - Assist students to complete their course with an alternative provider within our network of contacts |
| Minor Disruption | Short-term disruption to normal activities resulting from loss of power, unforeseen site maintenance, disruption owing to extreme weather conditions | <p>Measures that SCL will implement to mitigate against short-term disruption may include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Timetable changes, such as postponing and rescheduling face-to-face tuition / student contact sessions until normal activities can be safely resumed - Replacing scheduled face-to-face tuition with remote learning sessions - Temporarily utilising alternative nearby premises within the TSC group, or through alternative providers with comparable facilities |

- (1) When implementing any of the mitigation measures outlined above, SCL shall refer to their own Business Continuity Plan as required.
- (2) Should SCL be unable to deliver a programme of study that has already been paid for, financial compensation will be offered in line with our Refund Policy
